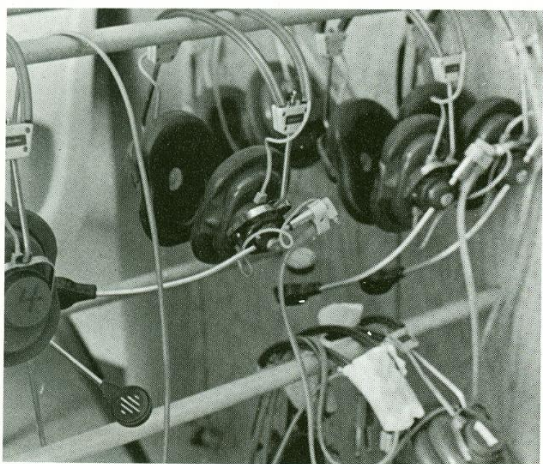


FRENCH FESTIVITIES EXPERIENCED BY W.H.S. STUDENTS
